Obligatory introductory courses include: 'Introduction to Maritime Civilizations A + B'; 'General and Coastal Geoarchaeology'; 'Science of the Mediterranean'; 'Mediterranean Course A + B'.

Students in track A (thesis writing) are required to take 'Scientific Writing'.

Field Trips Course - Dr. E. Nantet. Students are required to participate in at least 6 field-trips through their MA studies at the department.

The course 'Work Methods at Sea', taught by Dr. D. Cvikel, includes one week of field activity between semesters, and classroom meetings during the spring semester.

The course 'Advanced Field Methods in Coastal and Underwater Archaeology', taught by Dr. E. Nantet, includes one week of field survey between semesters.

The course 'Coastal and Underwater Archaeology Field School', taught by Prof. A. Yasur-Landau and Prof. R. Shahack-Gross, will include three weeks of excavation at the end of the academic year.

The course 'Research Cruise – Ecological Survey', taught by Prof. D. Angel, will take place during the spring semester, and will include a cruise and classroom meetings.
